Mr. SHAYS (for himself and Mr. MARKEY) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Homeland Security

A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Homeland Security to notify passengers when they are flying on an aircraft carrying unscreened cargo.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the 'Unscreened Cargo Notification Act'.

SEC. 2. WARNING REGARDING SCREENING OF AIR CARGO.

After the 180th day following the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland Security must notify all passengers flying on an aircraft operated by an air carrier that is carrying uninspected air cargo that they are flying on an aircraft that is carrying cargo that has not been screened for explosives and other hazardous materials.
